The Pancreatic Cancer Project is the brain-child of Dr. William Isacoff, Oncologist (Westwood). The Project is based on three premises: Money has been given to research on pancreatic cancer, but in too small

amounts and to the wrong researchers Those researchers who are capable of changing the landscape regarding Pancreatic cancer (7% survival rate) work in isolation publish perhaps Every seven years and have no means of benefitting from the critique of other leading researchers in the field of pancreatic cancer Even when there are breakthroughs in research, the findings are not translated to the chemotherapy treatment settings

The Pancreatic Cancer Project has identified the eight top research doctors on pancreatic cancer in the United States and is currently seeking \$200 million to fund this five year work. The eight scientists, along with additional highly regarded medical and scientific participant/observers will meet quarterly to share, under facilitated strict protocols, their research. Their findings will be available on the world wide web to all scientists within two weeks after each meeting.
